

### NICA Team—Season Recap

October 2019 marked the end of another successful season of XC bike racing for the Nevada Interscholastic Cycling League (NICL) which operates under NICA (National Interscholastic Cycling Association). The Nevada league was started in 2014 by Incline Village local Doug Bedient after years of driving his son to compete in Northern California (NorCal) league races. Four years later, NICL includes 18 teams and hundreds of students from as far away as Grass Valley and Mammoth. While the league is known as the Nevada league, several teams from California are represented as the drive to the NICL race venues is shorter than the NorCal races which are typically held closer to the California Bay area.

Representing the Alta Alpina club is the Alta Alpina Composite team. "Composite" means that we are not officially affiliated with any high school allowing us to recruit a blend of Douglas and South Tahoe students. The league encourages students from 6th grade through 12th to participate in a series of cross-country training rides and skills sessions over the summer. Four races are held in the fall for students who want a taste of competition. Racers compete on a four-mile XC loop that blends a mix of fire road and single track and 300-400 feet of climbing. Middle schoolers start with a 4 mile race while Varsity riders compete upward of 20 miles (5 laps) on the same course.

In 2019 (our fourth year as team in NICL), the Alta Alpina team grew under the watchful eye of head coach Drew Bray to 30 registered student athletes. A total of 18 registered coaches (many of them parents who enjoy riding along with the team) assisted throughout the season. Standouts this year were Varsity riders Justin Kinser and Audry Keasling whose points helped the team finish in 4th place overall at the end of the season (only 14 points shy of 3rd place Incline Village). In all, 8 Alta Alpina high school and 4 middle school riders took top 10 finishes in their respective categories including Freshman Boys overall points leader Lachlan Bray.

While we are sad to lose our two graduating seniors, we have a strong field of up and coming middle and high schoolers ready to lead us into the new year. Recruiting for the 2020 season will start in May. Club members who want to coach or help with the team are encouraged to contact team director Carlo Luri at AltaAlpinaNICA@gmail.com.

### Board Meeting Minutes—November 25, 2019

Meeting called to order at 5:39 pm

### 1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is \$9539.51. The Paypal balance is \$424.98. Frank will contact Lori Piccini to arrange payment for catering the dinner and to get an end of year clothing inventory. Frank is working to wrap up the accounts to hand-off to Lori Kroboth before the January meeting.
- Membership: Four new members at the fall party.
- Weekend Rides: Rick handed off all the ride information and plans to Bill. The board thanked him heartily for all his work as Weekend Ride Director.
- **Newsletter**: Newsletter is planned for release in the first week of December. Content requested from Nigel for annual wrap-up and from NICA team.
- Website: Jim put a lot of new work into the website to clear out and fix broken links.
- **Insurance**: Michael summarized all insurance spending from 2019 as this will play an important role in budgeting for 2020. We have a general liability policy, a D&O policy, a policy for the Challenge, and a policy that covers racing.
- Weekly Road Races: We still need to get chips back but so far more than a third are outstanding. Those that aren't returned will need to be replaced. Joseph pointed out that the chips are designed for 21 weeks of use--not 52-- so people shouldn't keep them on their bikes through the off-season. Michael will be handingoff to Joseph Whiteley as soon as possible.
- · Junior Team / NICA Team: No Report.
- Adopt A Highway: Thomas remains coordinator.
- **Pinenut Cracker**: Permit form reviewed. Key decision now is the date so it can be submitted.
- **Mixed Terrain**: The marketing plan involves a website that features the five CVARS loops along with fifteen mixed terrain rides that can be ridden throughout the year as a way to promote Carson Valley as a Mixed Terrain Cycling destination in partnership with CVAA.
- **Challenge**: Michael reviewed the outstanding items for closing the 2019 books. A yellow reflective vest is missing. We'll have to pay to replace if it isn't found. Changes for 2020 were presented at the fall party.
- **Bike Advocacy**: Michael, Jennie, and Carlo attended the Bike-Ped-Trails conference. It was a great opportunity to meet about the mixed terrain project.

- 2. **Fall Party Feedback:** RSVP reminders need to start earlier. We need to pick the date and speakers early and then really promote the event.
- 2020 Calendar: Michael presented a proposed full calendar of events for 2020. Tod will take on looking at spring party venues and dates for 2020. Tammy will look at venues and dates for November. Michael will book CVIC to hold dates. It was agreed that we will start the race series on April 16, skip July 2, and finish September 3. Dates for the Spring Century, Training Ride Series, Challenge, and CVARS were set. Michael will follow-up with Thomas on Highway Cleanups.
- 4. **Challenge Fees:** The board set the Challenge amounts and deadlines for the tiers of fees including the training rides and breakfast options.
- 5. **Training Series Name:** Send ideas for names with "Death" in them to Nigel.
- 6. **Challenge Marketing:** Board approved committing to Cycle California for a 1/4 page color ad for January with at least 4 ads to follow. [Frank/Nigel/Unanimous]
- 7. **Mixed Terrain Marketing:** Michael clarified status of grant and marketing budget.
- 8. **Appointment of Officials:** Michael moved that Joseph Whitely be appointed Race Director; Lee Griffith be appointed Spring Century Coordinator; Glynnis Miller be appointed Volunteer Coordinator responsible for recruiting, coordinating, and communicating with volunteers for events throughout the year; Gregg Westerbeck be appointed Social Media Coordinator; and Frank Dixon be appointed "Death Ride Training Series Coordinator" responsible for organizing and managing logistics, snacks, and support for the weekend rides designated as training rides. [Michael/Nigel/Unanimous]
- 9. **Club Budgeting:** Frank will work on a pro-forma cash flow for 2020 before handing off to Lori. All board members need to provide Lori with a detailed budget for their area of responsibility.
- 10. **Member Survey:** Tod will start work on a club survey by distributing proposed questions to the board for review.
- 11. **Challenge Expenses:** Motion to reimburse Michael \$500 plus \$880 just returned from the 2015 Washington Fire loss. [Nigel/Frank/Michael Abstained/Unanimous]
