Our main season got underway in April with the novel "Spring Rider Roundup" in Genoa. This got us out on a selection of road and mountain bike rides, then back for

the all important picnic in Genoa Town Park. It also gave Allen F the chance

to sign up and renew some members, and for Bruce E to move some of our clothing stock.

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Soon after that came the beginning of Joseph W's road race series, still in the popular socially-distanced time-trial format. Meanwhile Leon M had already started the weekend rides back in March, and kept them going through to December. A monumental effort! Also filling the ride board every weekend was Gregg W, supplementing his Social Media role with postings for the Saturday Big Daddy's world championship rides (races?). Another rideboard regular was the Tuesday Evening Mountain bike rides, setting out to tackle a different valley or Tahoe trail every week, for the entire season.

In early summer came a couple of key developments - Joseph kicked the road races into second gear by re-starting the in-person Thursday evening race series. With invaluable help from Anita. Meanwhile the crew of NICA coaches started getting the youth squad out mountain biking again. This program has gone from strength to strength under Drew Bray's guidance.

Of course the big event for late June was our Alta Alpina Challenge. It was particularly efficiently run this year by Michael, eventually turning a net profit of over \$11K. That was a great boost for the club finances, and justification for the volunteer time you all put in. Thank you!

Who remembers what happened next? The Death Ride happened a couple of weeks later? No! Thwarted by the Tamarack fire. Which set the scene for the rest of the summer really. Dixie sent smoke down from the north, then Caldor sent an apocalypse from the west. Many of us scurried from our houses in fear. More rides and races were canceled than held. The nimble made forays down the Sierras (or further) for riding during breaks from the smoke.

Thankfully we did have houses to come home to, and the smoke cleared enough by October for Dave S to run another successful Tim Rowe Memorial ride, closing out the main events calendar. Thanks to Hank as the pit-stop crew.

Thanks also to our many behind-the-scenes board members: Jennie H managing the finances, Jim S keeping our website up to date, Carlo L maintaining cycling advocacy while also coaching for NICA, Brian D putting in the ground work to restart the Pinenut Cracker, and Michael B producing such a professional Paceline newsletter.

Alta Alpina Composite youth mountain bike team had a great 2021 season. The team endured smoke interrupted practices schedules and evacuations due to the Tamarack and Caldor Fires. Our regular season runs from July through mid October. The team competed in 4 races at Walker River, Mammoth, and in Reno at Sierra Vista and Hidden Valley. Overall 28 student athletes competed in the race series. The athletes had very competitive races and all worked very hard to achieve their best results. The team achieved 4th place in the series and won 3rd place at the Sierra Vista race. We celebrated our senior athletes Zane Fink and Alex Beane having a great race season before moving onto bigger adventures beyond school. They both had a successful race season and

achieved 4th and 5th place in the series overall results. Zane and his father Pete had a big adventure for their summer break and rode bikes from Canada to Mexico via the Great Divide Mountain Bike Route. It was a journey of 2,696 miles criss-crossing the Continental Divide from the Montana border with Canada to Antelope Wells at the Mexican border. Several student athletes and coaches rode and competed at the Sea Otter Classic Mountain Bike festival and raced well to win 3 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze medal! The team finished a great year with a Halloween dress up ride on Clear Creek trail with pizza and a tailgate movie to end the night.

Board Meeting Minutes—November 1, 2021

Meeting called to order at 8:17pm

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
 - Treasurer: Balances are unchanged from October. Jennie proposed making a \$200 donation to TAMBA to support their efforts in postfire trail repair. The board agreed. [Michael I Jennie I Unanimous]. Joseph will send Jennie a summary of income and expenses for the 2021 race season.
 - Membership: Twelve people submitted membership fee payments in 2021 but failed to submit their membership waiver forms. The board agreed to defer their memberships to 2022 (they will be asked again to submit their waivers) [Michael I Jennie I Unanimous]. Any new memberships received before January 1 will be held and processed in the new year.
 - Weekend Rides: Leon will continue to schedule weekend rides as long as the weather allows.
 The Big Daddy Saturday rides will also continue.
 After the winter break rides will resume with a spring meeting kick-off. Nigel encouraged Leon to round up a team of ride leaders for 2022 and Jennie suggested holding a coordinating meeting early in the season.

- MTB Rides: Nigel announced that the November 2 ride will conclude the seasons MTB Tuesday ride series season.
- · Social Media: No Report.
- Newsletter: It was decided that the next issue would be Nov/Dec volume to be released right after the December meeting.
- · Website: No Report.
- Insurance: Nothing to report.
- Clothing: Drew and Michael are still working on find vendors for NICA and club clothing for next year.
- Weekly Road Races: Joseph reported that there are at least 10 chips that still need to be recovered so that he can check them all over the winter. Joseph is also working on a survey of past racers to inform plans for 2022.
- Pinenut Cracker: Carlo pointed out that the Stetina pay dirt event has been rescheduled for the date we had been planning to stage the Pinenut Cracker so we'll need a new date. We're leaning towards May 21.
- Challenge: Michael outlined the broad plans for the 2022 marketing strategy. He has been in



contact with the ACCC about the possibility of coordination for early season rides on closed roads. We're still waiting on them to confirm the rest of the details around our planned collaboration for the Death Ride Training Series. The uncertainty right now complicates rolling out our registration and marketing. Possible candidates for roles in managing the Death Ride Training Series were discussed. Brian will contact some of these people.

- Bike Advocacy: The Carson Valley Trails
 Association will be meeting with the USFS
 regarding work on the Indian Hills trails plan. It is
 hoped that work can begin before the end of the
 year. He also reported that Capitol Connector
 Trail may be opening soon.
