AACC Weekend Ride Schedule—July/August

We have a full schedule for the months of July and August but we are still seeking volunteers to lead more rides in the 20-30 mile range.

Sunday, July 16, 2017 — Sonora Pass

Meet to carpool from the Gardnerville Grocery Outlet parking lot at 7:45am. We'll meet outside the Caltrans station on US395 at CA108 (park near but outside the gate) and be ready to roll at 9:15am. This ride has spectacular scenery and about 7,100 feet of climbing, some of it quite steep. Ride CA108 from US35, up and over Sonora Pass at 9600 ft elevation, down to Dardanelles Resort at about 5000 feet, and return. Dardanelles Resort has a convenience store for Gatorade and Fritos and running water. Bring a bike with good brakes, low gears and plenty of water. total, is a very respectable, tough, steep ride, so consider joining us for an east-side-only ride if the whole thing sounds like too much. Last year about half the group turned around at the top, ideally that would happen again so everyone's got someone to ride back with. We'll have cold drinks and snacks at the end. The group usually stops at Walker Burger on the way back home.

Saturday, July 22, 2017 — I-580 Opening Celebration

The new segment of I-580 that completes the bypass of Carson City will open in early August. NDOT is inviting the community to celebrate the new segment with a preview ride/run/walk event on July 22. We'll meet at the NDOT-designated parking area on the new segment of freeway just south of Fairview. Be there ready to ride at 9:00am. After riding the new stretch of Freeway we'll ride out-and-back on Deer Run for a total of 20-26 miles of easy riding. Sunday, July 23, 2017 — Adopt-A-Highway Cleanup

Meet at Turtle Rock Park at 7:30am for our annual July highway cleanup. Trash has been spotted in the area so we'll have some work to do but it doesn't take much time as we fan out to cover our stretch of adopted highway. We'll have snacks and ride Ebbetts afterwards. You should have long pants, solid footwear, and workgloves for picking up trash.

Saturday, July 29, 2017 — Mormon Emigrant Loop

There are three carpool spots: 8:00am at the base of Old Meyers Grade, 8:00am at the south end of Douglas High School parking lot in Minden, and 8:30am at Burnside Lake parking lot in Hope Valley. The ride starts from the Mormon Emigrant rest area parking off Mormon Emigrant Trail near the intersection with CA88 (See map: www.altaalpina.org/challenge/images/MormonEmigrantSnoPark.png). This is a scenic loop with about 7000 ft of climbing, mainly through remote, narrow, shady, and poorly marked forest service roads. There's a campground half-way that should have water, but please bring plenty of food and water and a bike that's in good working order, as there are no other services along the way. The first half is a rolling descent, the 2nd half is a rolling climb, so pace yourself accordingly. There's one section of dirt road/broken pavement for a couple miles, so we recommend 25mm or 28mm tires. The roads really are not marked, so it's important on this ride that we regroup and wait for everyone fairly regularly.

AACC Weekend Ride Schedule-July/August (cont.)

Sunday, August 6, 2017 - Star Lake MTB

Meet at Heavenly Valley Stagecoach Parking Lot and be ready to ride by 8:30am. This is an out-and-back mountain bike ride on the Tahoe Rim Trail. The route is all single track with some technical granite steps, some smooth swooshy sections, and fabulous views. Our destination and turn-around is a beautiful, remote alpine lake. The total mileage is about 16 miles.

Saturday, August 12, 2017 - Project HERO/GE Ride

Project HERO sponsor GE and Alta Alpina Cycling Club are co-hosting a family friendly ride and celebration for Minden GE employees, Alta Alpina Club members, Project HERO Veteran riders, and local community members/ supporters! For more details, or to RSVP, visit www.facebook.com/groups/ProjectHEROCityofReno/. All rides will start and end at the Bently Science Park (off Buckeye and Orchard outside Minden). The event starts at 9:00am there will be a variety of ride distance options ranging from 5 miles to 41 miles. Following the ride, local food trucks will be available for lunch as well as family games and activities! Come support this great Veterans Cycling Program!

Sunday, August 13, 2017 — Ride around Lake Tahoe & BBQ

Meet at Dave Scarborough's house, ready to ride, at 8:30am (see address posted on website rideboard). We'll ride clockwise around the lake at a medium casual pace—a distance of about 72 miles. We will have snacks and BBQ leftovers from the Spring Century afterwards. Please let us know if you are coming so we know how much food to defrost (davescar30@gmail.com or call (530)318-7878).

Saturday, August 18 to 20, 2017 - Gold Lake Weekend

We plan to camp at the <u>Gold Lakes Campground</u> about 10 miles up Gold Lake Highway from CA89 at Graeagle. (We can't make reservations but we plan to have a group get there on Friday afternoon to get campsites.) On Saturday we'll ride the 60 mile Gold Lake Loop (the loop formed by CA89, CA49, and Gold Lake Highway). On Sunday we'll do a mountain bike ride and/or road ride to Lake Davis. Saturday, August 26, 2017 — Markleeville to Lake Alpine

Meet behind the courthouse in Markleeville ready to ride at 8:00am. We'll ride to the top of Ebbetts Pass, down to Hermit Valley, up Pacific Grade, and out to the Lodge at Lake Alpine. Bring money for lunch/snacks at the Lodge. The total distance is about 70 miles with about 8000 feet of climbing.

Saturday, September 16, 2017 — Pack Saddle Pass

Meet at the bottom of Old Meyers Grade (at South Upper Truckee Rd.). Be ready to roll at 8:00am. This ride will cover 70 miles and 8,300 feet of climbing. We go over Meyers Grade, east on US50, south over Packsaddle Pass to Mormon Emigrant, then out to CA88, and back via Luther Pass. There are long distances with no services available. We'll have snacks at the end, but be sure to bring at least two water bottles and some money for the store at Kit Carson.

Saturday, September 23, 2017 - Tahoe City to Cisco Grove

Meet in Tahoe City in the parking area next to the river adjacent to Transit Center. Be ready to ride at 8:00am. We'll ride out to Truckee and have our first stop at The Outlets/Paco's on Donner Pass Road. Those who want a shorter ride can meet us there at 9:15am. We'll then ride up and over the summit on Highway 40 (Old Donnor Pass Rd.) and then join the I-80 frontage road down to Cisco Grove and return to Tahoe City by the same route for a total of 70 miles (50 miles for those starting from Paco's).

Saturday, October 7, 2017 - Tim Rowe Memorial Fall Century

To carpool to the start, meet at 8:30am in the parking lot for Lampe Park in Gardnerville. We start from CG Bar in Wellington at 9:15am. The ride goes up and over Sweetwater Pass to Bridgeport and returns by the same route. There will be a rest stop with snacks and drinks at the top of Sweetwater but we recommend bring money for food in Bridgeport. There will be pizza for everyone at the end of the ride. The full distance is about 84 miles.

Rumble Strips

Rumble strips may be coming to the highways we love to ride. For much of the year, the great folks in the Alpine County Community Development Department have been working to persuade Caltrans not to add Rumble Strips to CA88, CA89, and CA4 as they are dangerous to the thousands of cyclists that come to Alpine County. The club has also made a number of submissions to argue against adding rumble strips. Unfortunately, we've just been advised that the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has issued new guidelines which, according to our Caltrans contact, conclude that **rumble strips have "no impact on bicyclists**". He went on to indicate that this conclusion was reached "because there was no outreach to the bicycling community and that bicycle crashes from rumble strips are not reported to police". In other words they didn't actually seek to determine if rumble strips impacted cyclists, they just didn't have any data that they did.

CalTrans has advised us that **every cyclist needs to report every safety incident involving a rumble strip** so that entries are generated in the Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System (SWITRS). If you experience or witness any incident involving a rumble strip in California, make a point of reporting it to CHP by calling 1-800-TELL-CHP (1-800-835-5247). Make sure that CHP documents the incident you're reporting using **CHP form 555** which means it will get recorded into the SWITRS database.

Races will take place rain or shine. However, the Race Steward reserves the right to adjust the course, format, timing, or number of laps to reflect local conditions. If a race must be terminated early all racers will receive 5 points.

Race Registration

Register for each race between 5:30pm and 6:00pm. If you already have a season pass you just go to the front of the line and check-in. If not, and it's your first race, allow time to register and get your RFID chip.

Rule for Crashes

Crashes are rare, but we had two at the Diamond Valley Double Back. Our rule is that if a crash occurs, everyone in the vicinity should to stop to help. The race for everyone in the affected category will be neutralized and everyone will receive 10 points. When it is appropriate, racers may resume but they will be racing "for fun". In the even more unlikely event that more than one category stopped to assist at the scene of the crash, the different categories should resume separately.

Board Meeting Minutes—July 10, 2017

Meeting called to order at 6:04 pm

 Measure C: Leon Malmed presented details of the City of South Lake Tahoe ballot measure "C" which will be before the residents of South Lake Tahoe in the upcoming November 2017 elections. As an active cyclist, Leon has taken on the issue of dangerously degraded roads and is heading up the campaign to implement an earmarked 0.5% sales tax to be used exclusively for the repair of city roads. Leon asked the club to endorse his campaign. The board voted to do so (Michael/ Tammy/Carried 3-1).

2. Monthly Status Reports:

- Treasurer: No Report.
- **Membership**: There are 164 fully paid members. Michael reported that he continues to talk with local bike shops about ways we can partner better to grow our membership. There was some discussion of the subject of marketing the benefits of club membership and the importance of being consistent in our outreach activities.
